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ABOUT

Lamesa, TX Micro Area has a population of 13,317 people with a median age of 33.1 and a median household income of \$42,354. Between 2015 and 2016 the population of Lamesa, TX Micro Area declined from 13,542 to 13,317, a 1.66% decrease and its median household income grew from \$41,095 to \$42,354, a 3.06% increase.

The population of Lamesa, TX Micro Area is 55.6% Hispanic, 37.3% White, and 5.53% Black. 38% of the people in Lamesa, TX Micro Area speak a non-English language, and 94.5% are U.S. citizens.

The largest universities in Lamesa, TX Micro Area are Howard College, with 489 graduates, Southwest Collegiate Institute for the Deaf, with 27 graduates, and N/A, with N/A graduates.

The median property value in Lamesa, TX Micro Area is \$62,200, and the homeownership rate is 71.5%. Most people in Lamesa, TX Micro Area commute by Drove Alone, and the average commute time is 16.6 minutes. The average car ownership in Lamesa, TX Micro Area is 2 cars per household.

Lamesa, TX Micro Area is a metropolitan statistical area countaining Dawson County, TX and the census places Lamesa, TX; O'Donnell, TX; and Welch, TX.

ECONOMY

The economy of Lamesa, TX Micro Area employs 4,870 people. The economy of Lamesa, TX Micro Area is specialized in Mining, Quarrying, Oil, Gas Extraction; Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, Hunting; and Public Admin., which employ respectively 16.93; 9.76; and 2.05 times more people than what would be expected in a location of this size. The largest industries in Lamesa, TX Micro Area are Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, Hunting (518), Retail trade (516), and Educational Services (489), and the highest paying industries are Mining, Quarrying, Oil, Gas Extraction (\$63,625), Utilities (\$58,889), and Transportation & Warehousing (\$54,444).

Median household income in Lamesa, TX Micro Area is \$42,354. Males in Lamesa, TX Micro Area have an average income that is 1.75 times higher than the average income of females, which is \$30,672. The income inequality of Lamesa, TX Micro Area (measured using the Gini index) is 0.445 which is lower than the national average.

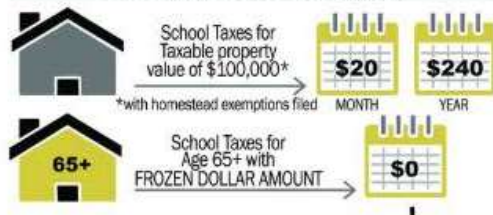

Lamesa High School

Lamesa High School houses grades nine through twelve and has approximately 500 students. These students are directed by 40 teachers.

Lamesa Middle School

Lamesa Middle School serves grades six through eight and has approximately 400 students. Middle School students receive instruction from 31 teachers. A \$4 million renovation of the campus was completed in January of 2008.

North Elementary

North Elementary contains grades three through five and has approximately 500 students and 25 teachers. A \$5.2 million renovation of the campus has recently been completed.

South Elementary

The newly remodeled South Elementary houses 600 pre-kindergarten through second grade students. There are 37 teachers at this school.

Technology

Lamesa I.S.D. prides itself in having the most current technology available with all campuses networked together through wireless antennas. We have Internet access in all of our classrooms. Several districts in West Texas have patterned their technology programs after ours. We have also had school districts from other states come and visit our district to view our system.

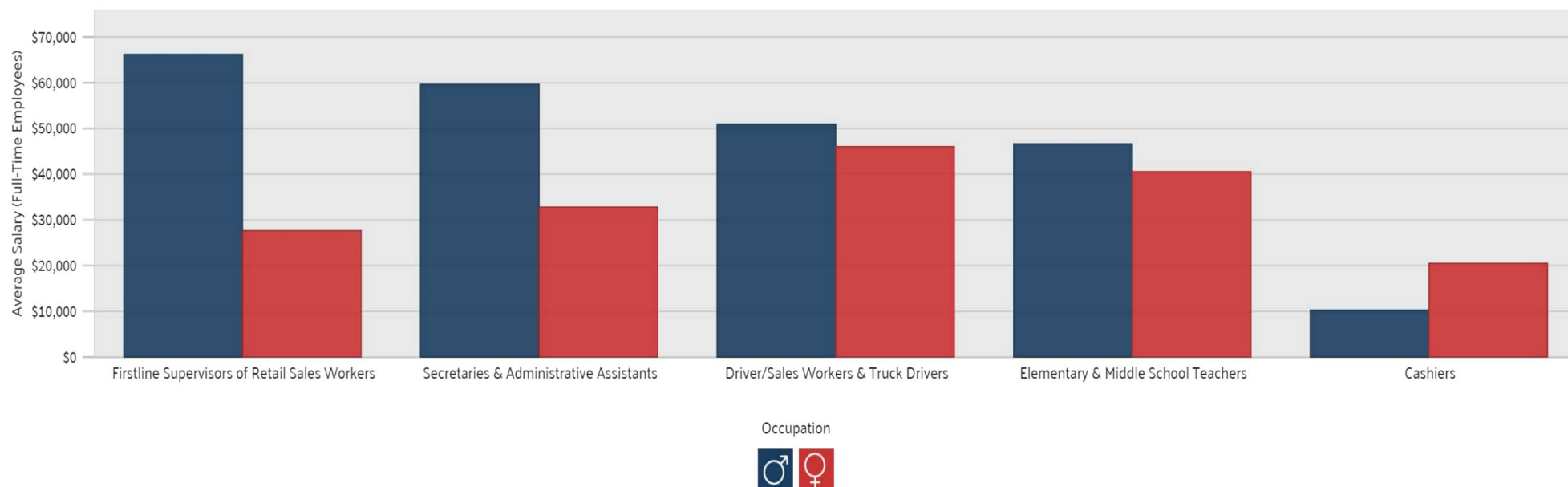

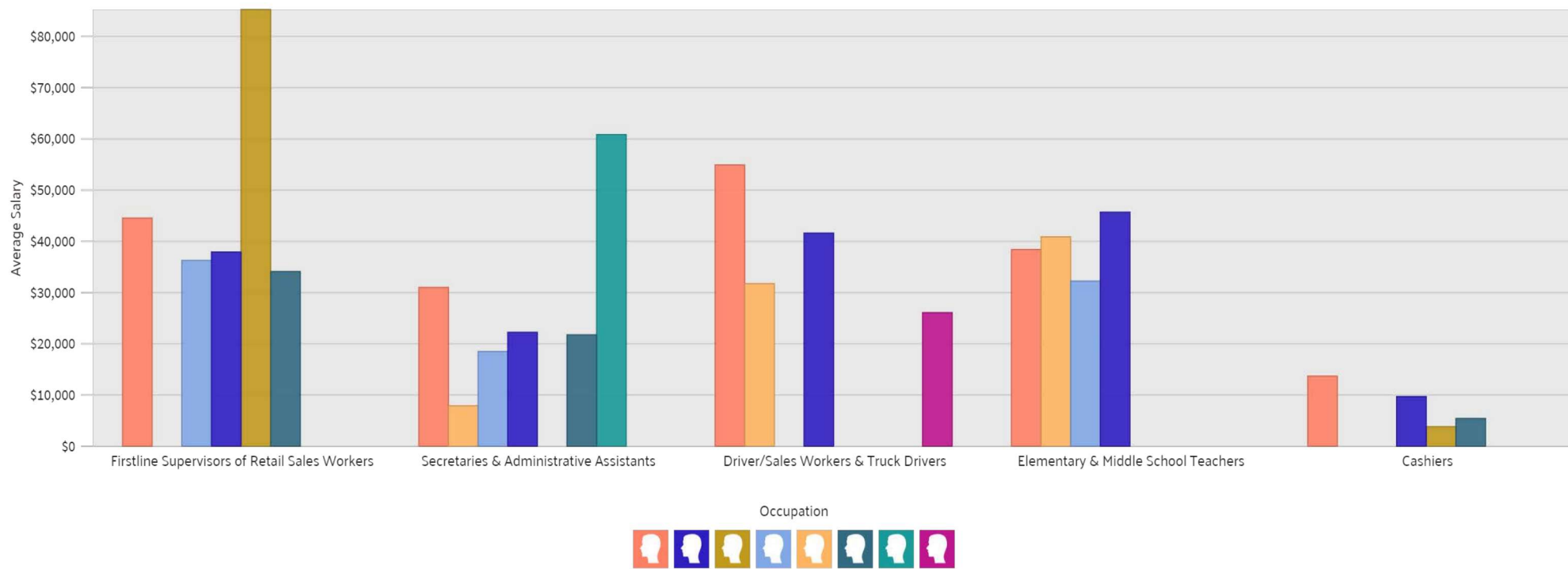

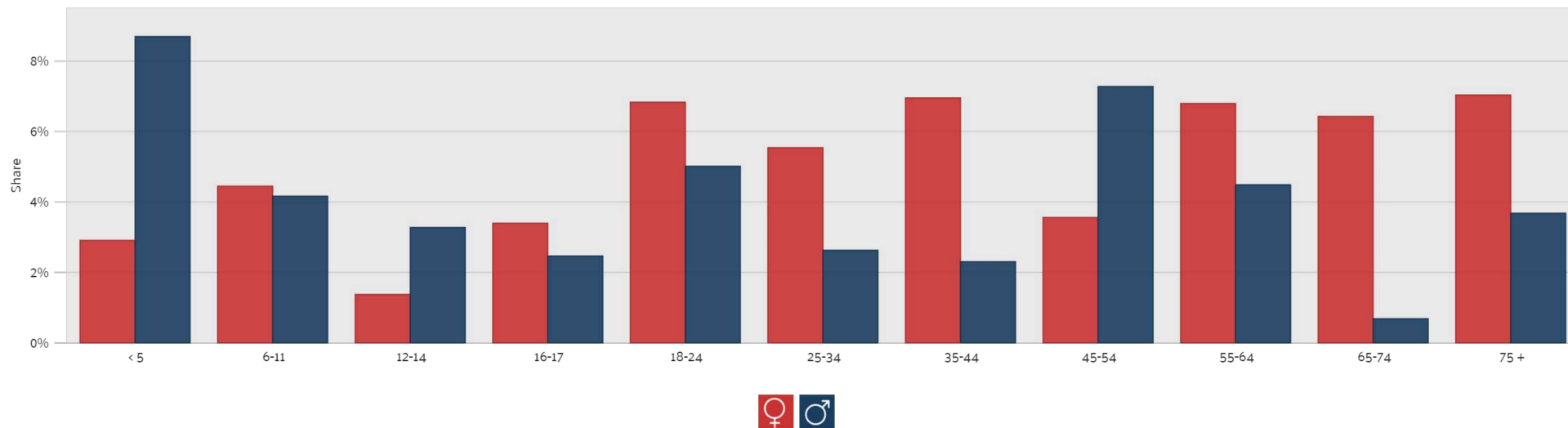




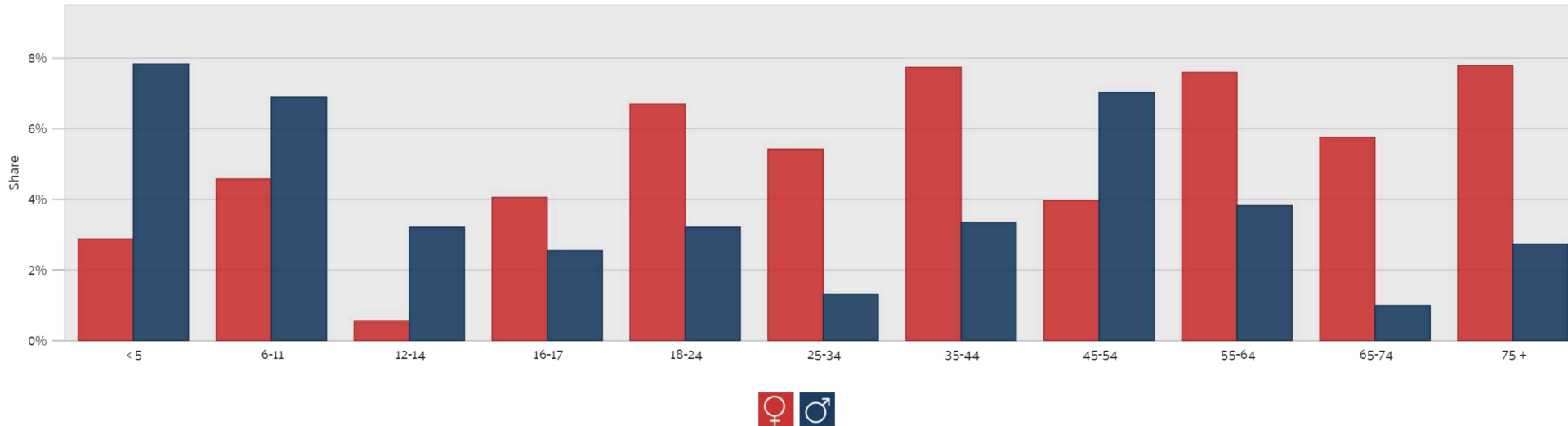
POVERTY BY AGE AND GENDER

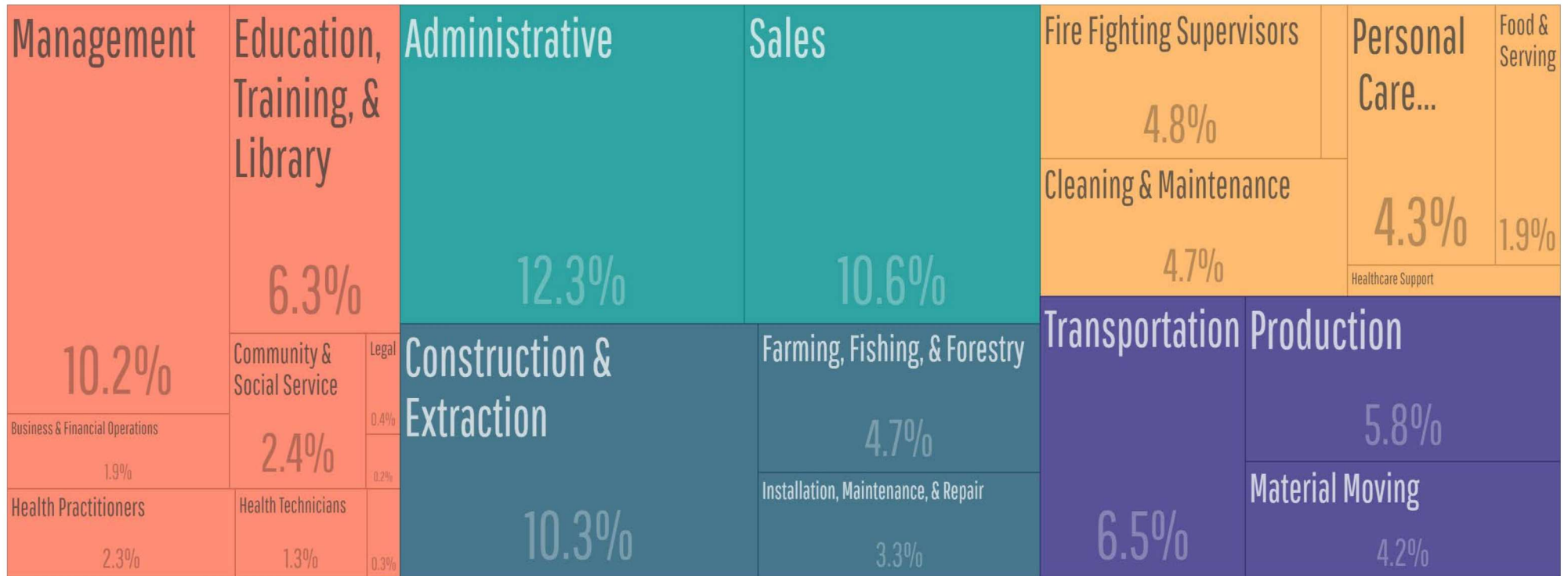

Most Specialized ACS Occupations in Lamesa, TX



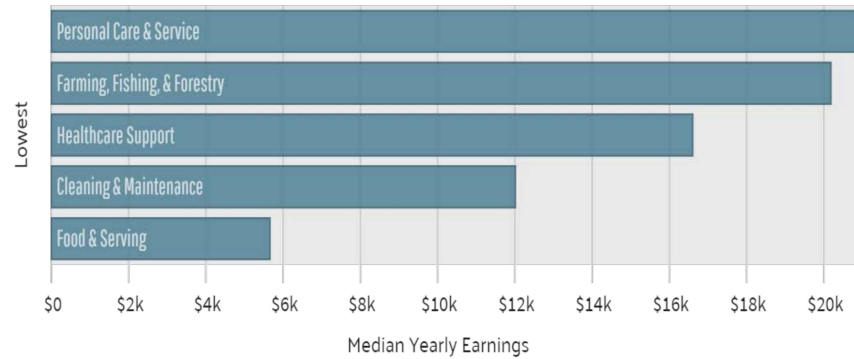

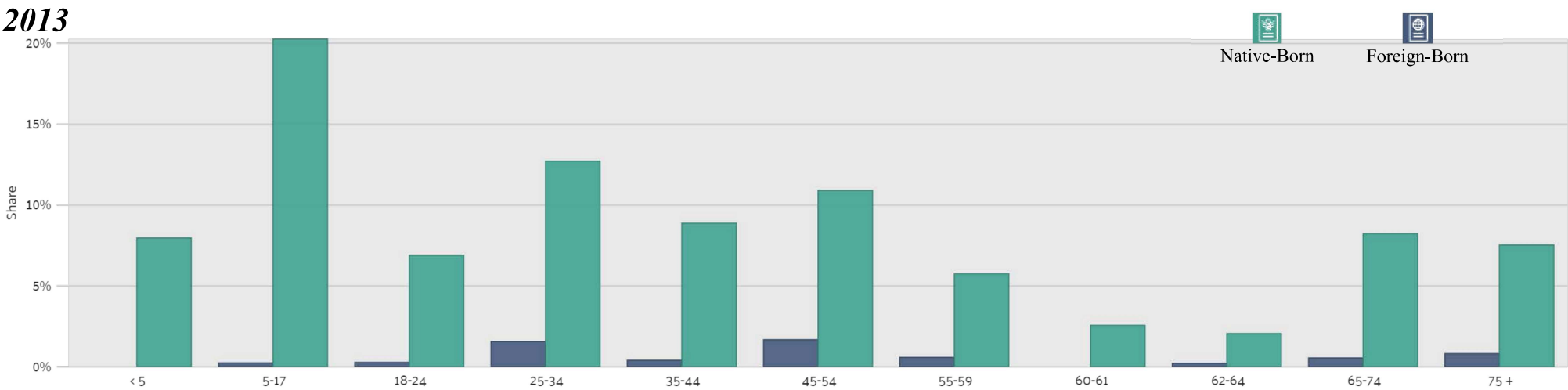
Lamesa, TX is home to a population of 9,367 people, from which 95.8% are citizens. The ethnic composition of the population of Lamesa, TX is composed of 5,535 Hispanic residents (59.1%), 3,552 White residents (37.9%), 167 Black residents (1.78%), 76 Asian residents (0.81%), and 21 Two+ residents (0.22%). The most common foreign languages in Lamesa, TX are Spanish (3,025 speakers), Chinese (60 speakers), and Greek (25 speakers), but compared to other places, Lamesa, TX has a relative high number of Greek (25 speakers), Spanish (3,025 speakers), and German (22 speakers).

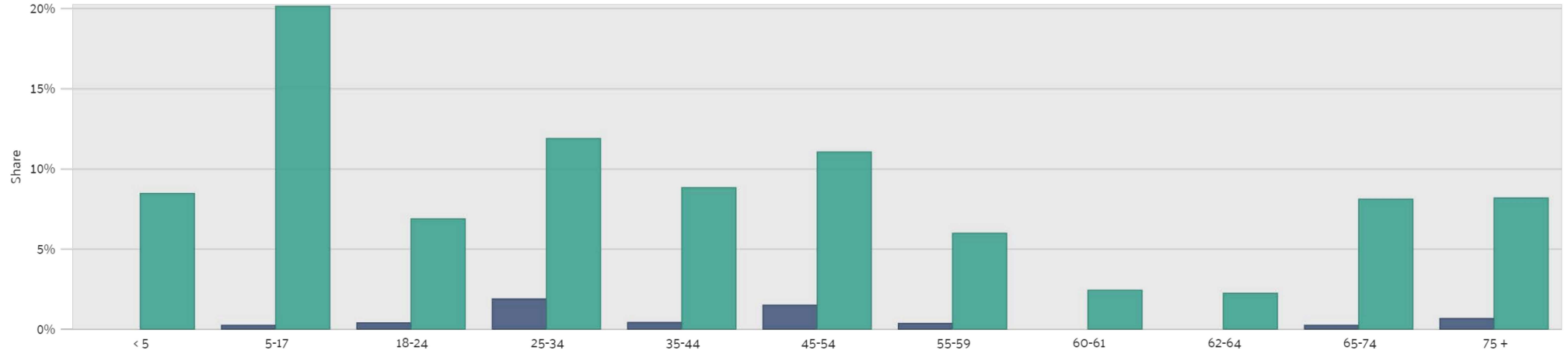
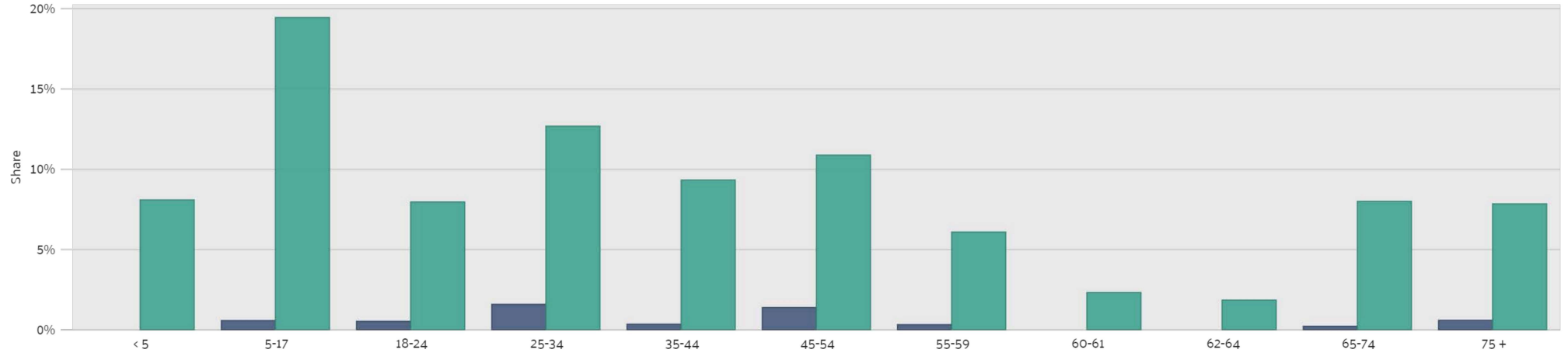

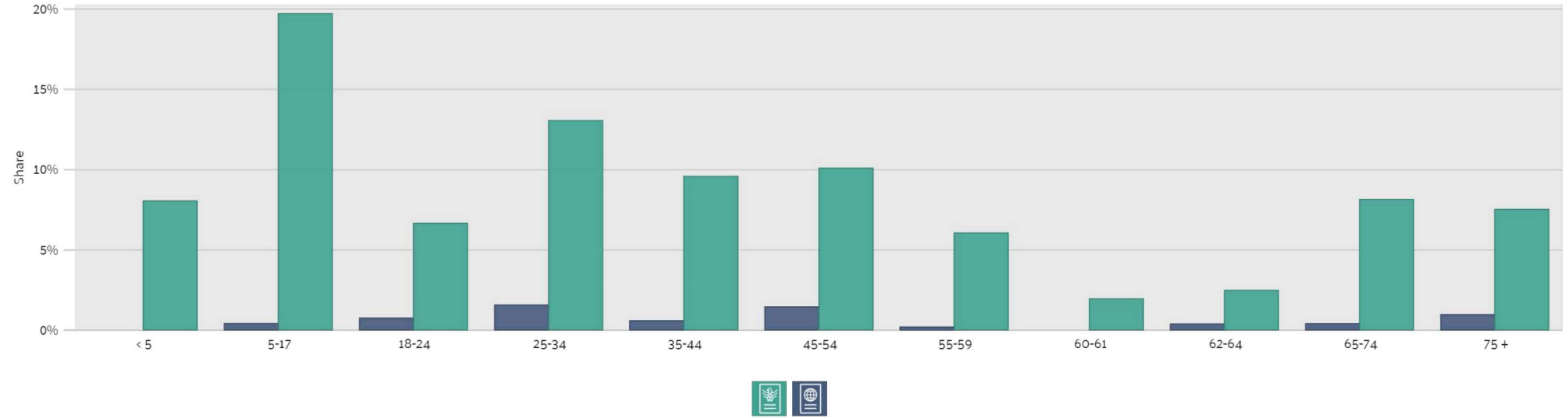

In 2016, the most common birthplace for the foreign-born residents of Concho Valley COG & Permian Basin Regional Planning Commission (East) PUMA, TX was Mexico, the natal country of 9,343 Concho Valley COG & Permian Basin Regional Planning Commission (East) PUMA, TX residents, followed by El Salvador with 371 and Cuba with 306.

When compared to other public use microdata areas, Concho Valley COG & Permian Basin Regional Planning Commission (East) PUMA, TX has a relatively high number of residents that were born in Other Africa- Not Specified. In 2016, there were 22 people from Other Africa- Not Specified living in Concho Valley COG & Permian Basin Regional Planning Commission (East) PUMA, TX, approximately 2.54 times more than would be expected based on national averages.

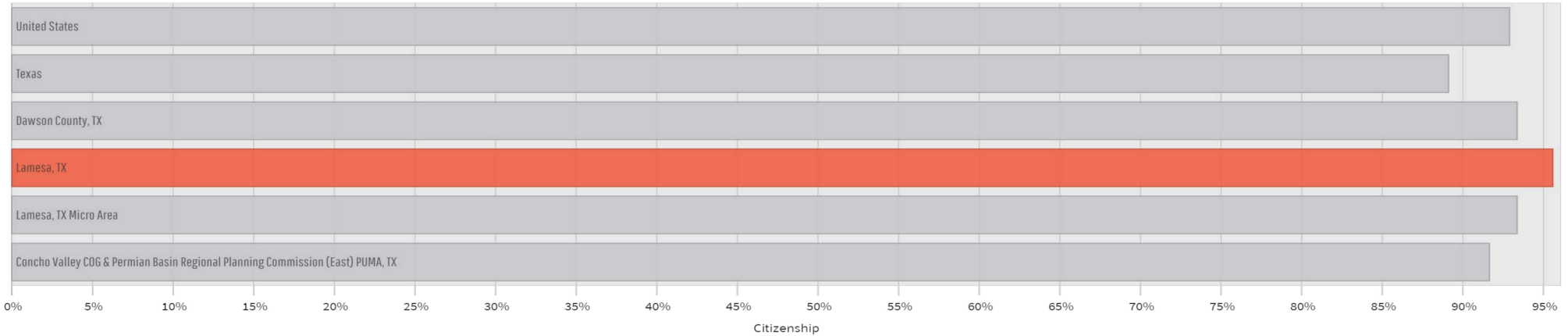

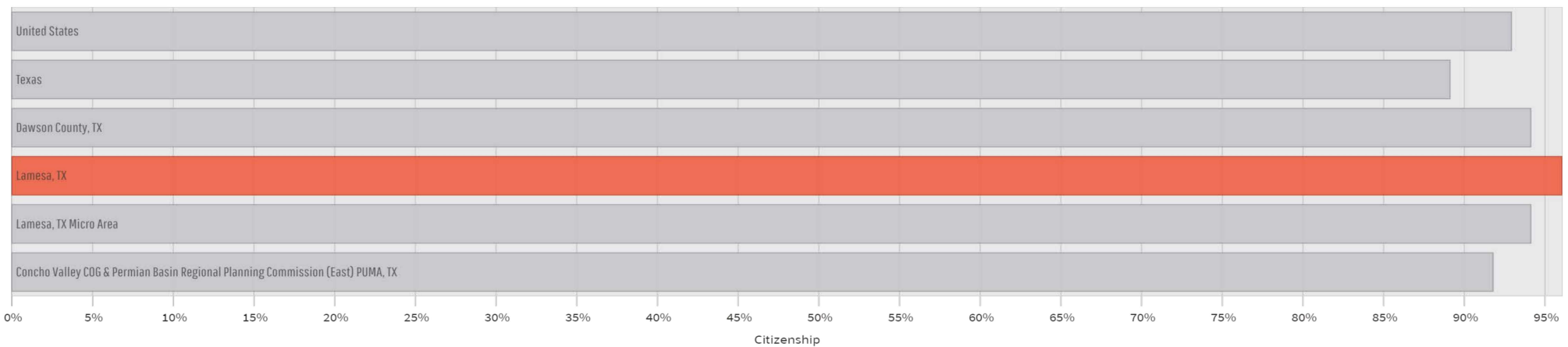

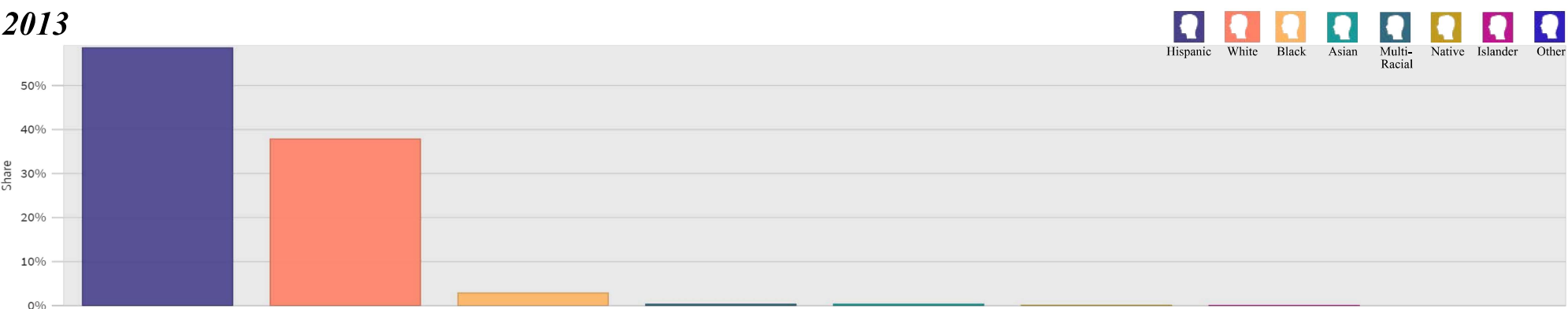

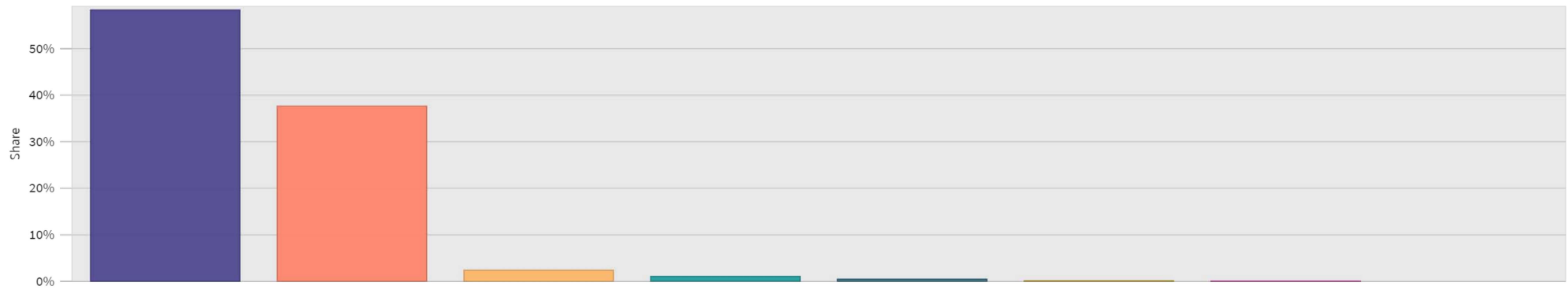

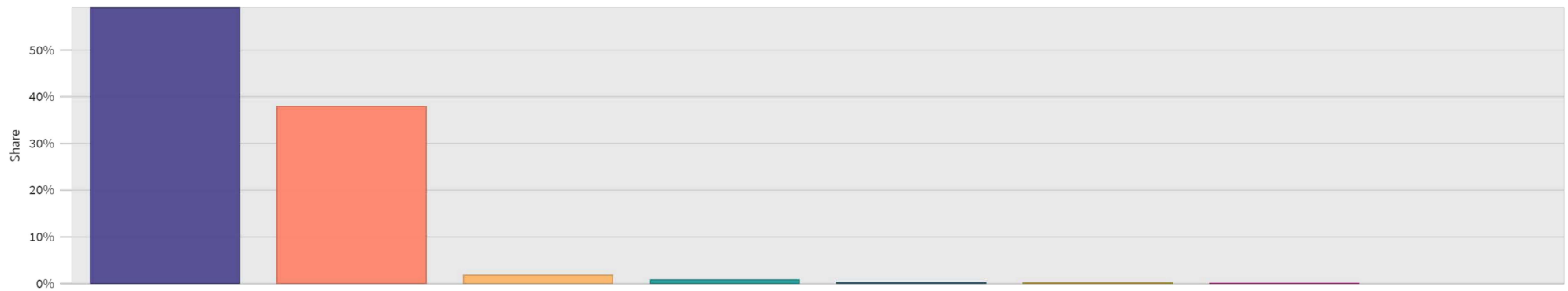

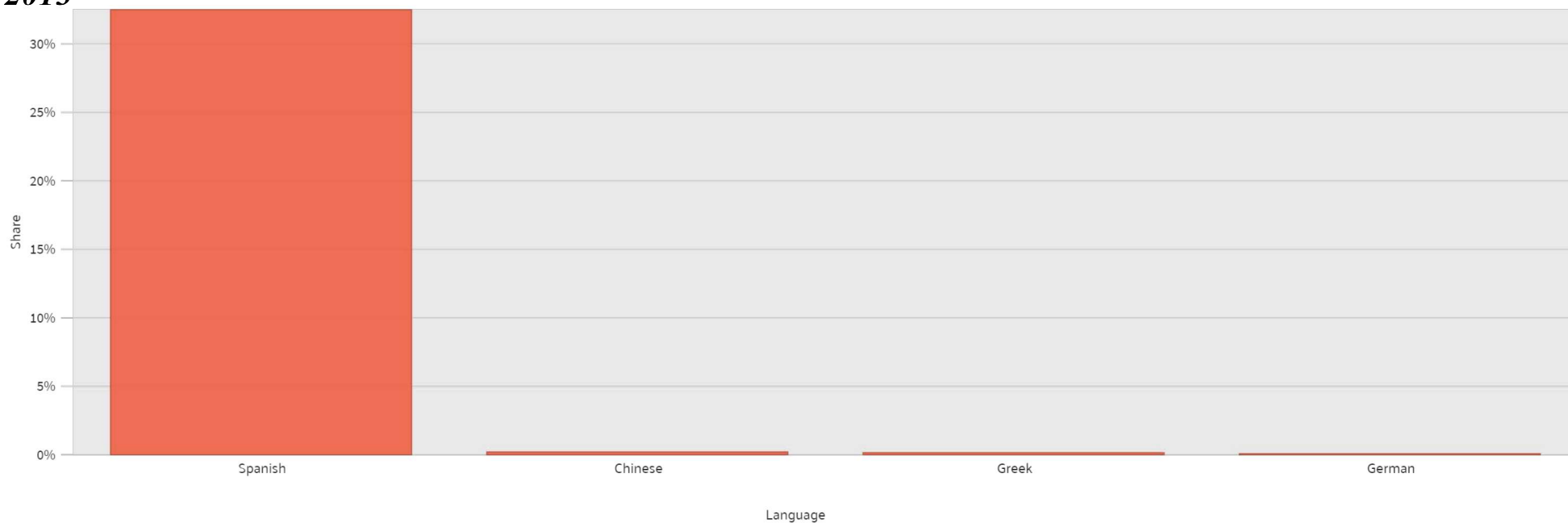
HERITAGE - Non-English Speakers (cont.)

3,142 of Lamesa, TX citizens are speakers of a non-English language, which is higher than the national average of 21.1%. In 2015, the most common non-English language spoken in Lamesa, TX was Spanish. 32.3% of the overall population of Lamesa, TX are native Spanish speakers. 0.64% speak Chinese and 0.27% speak Greek, the next two most common languages.

When compared to other census places, Lamesa, TX has a relatively high number of residents that are native Greek speakers. In 2015, there were 25 native Greek speakers living in Lamesa, TX, approximately 2.64 times more than would be expected based on the language's frequency in the US more broadly.

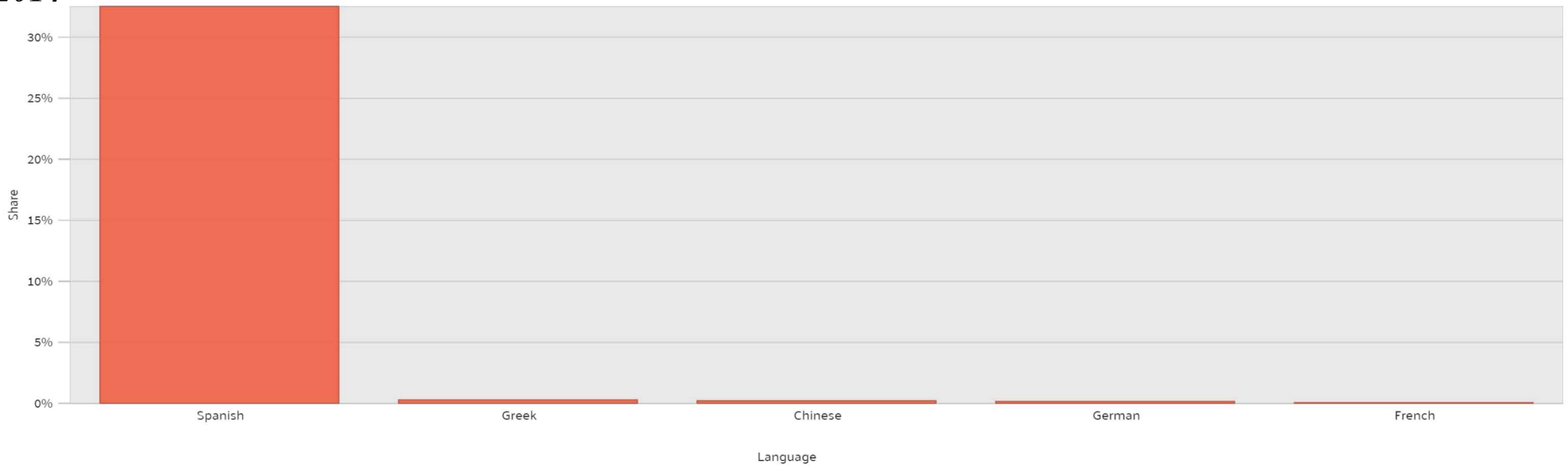

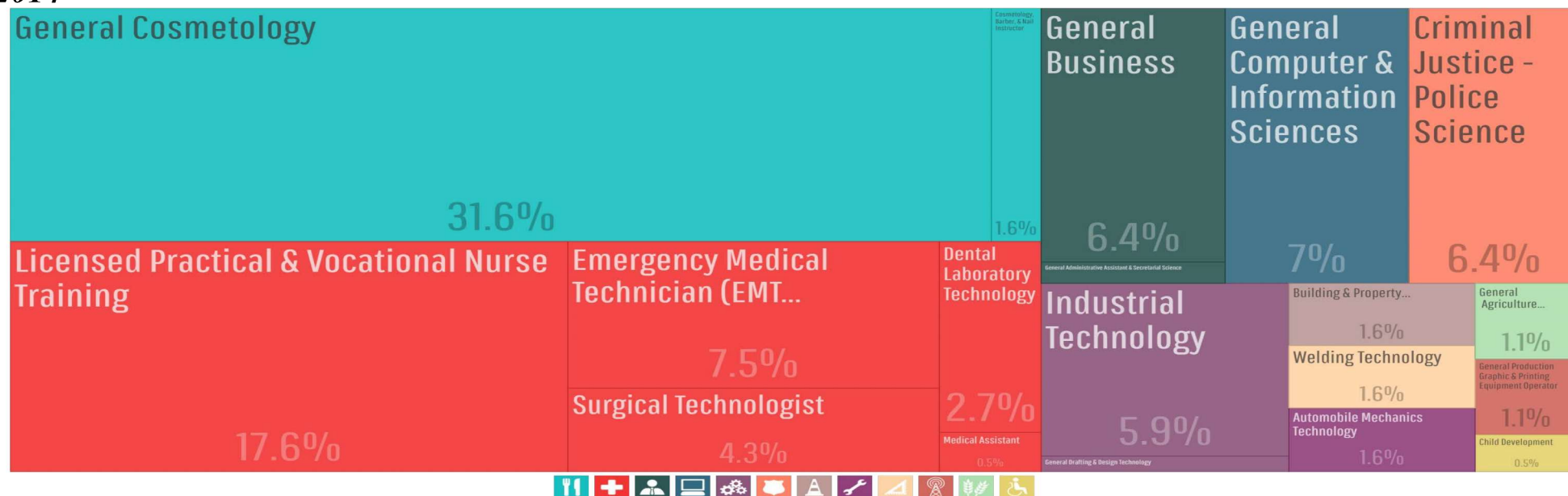

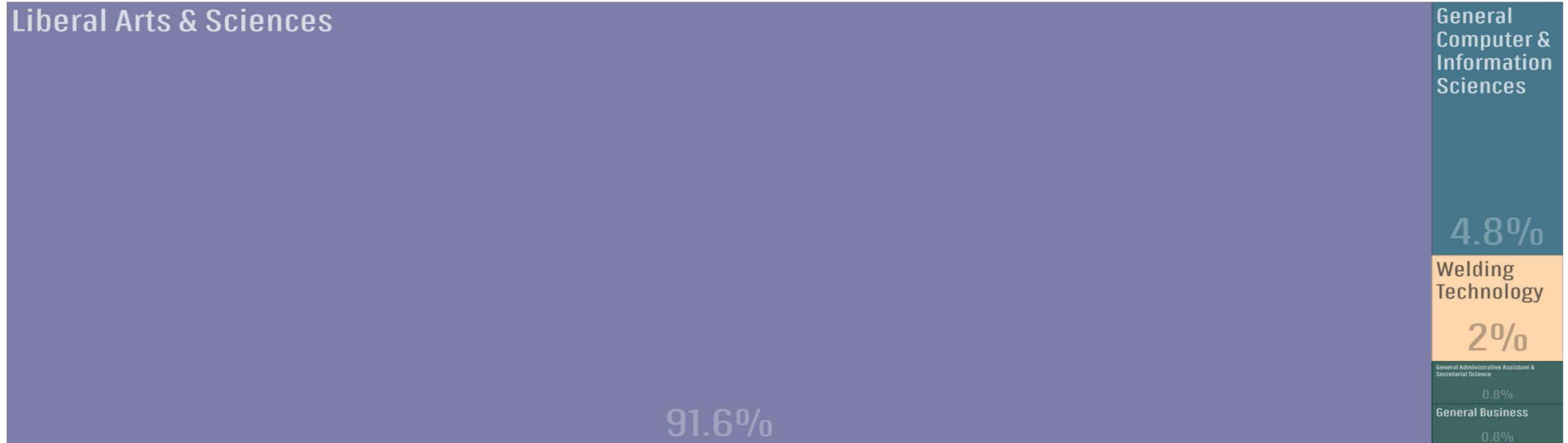

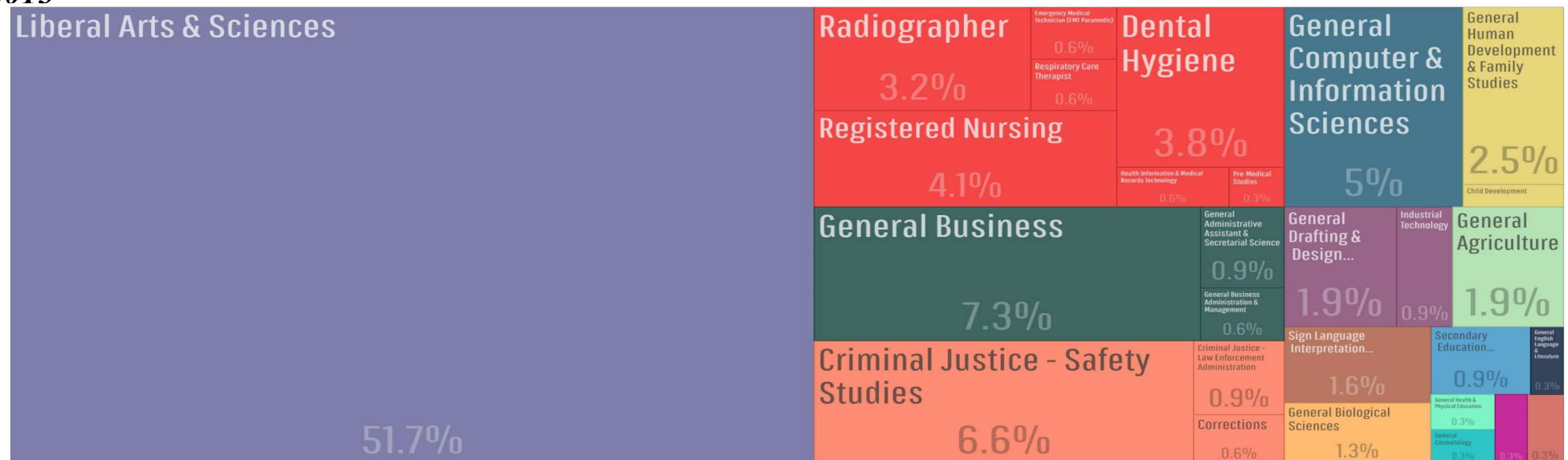

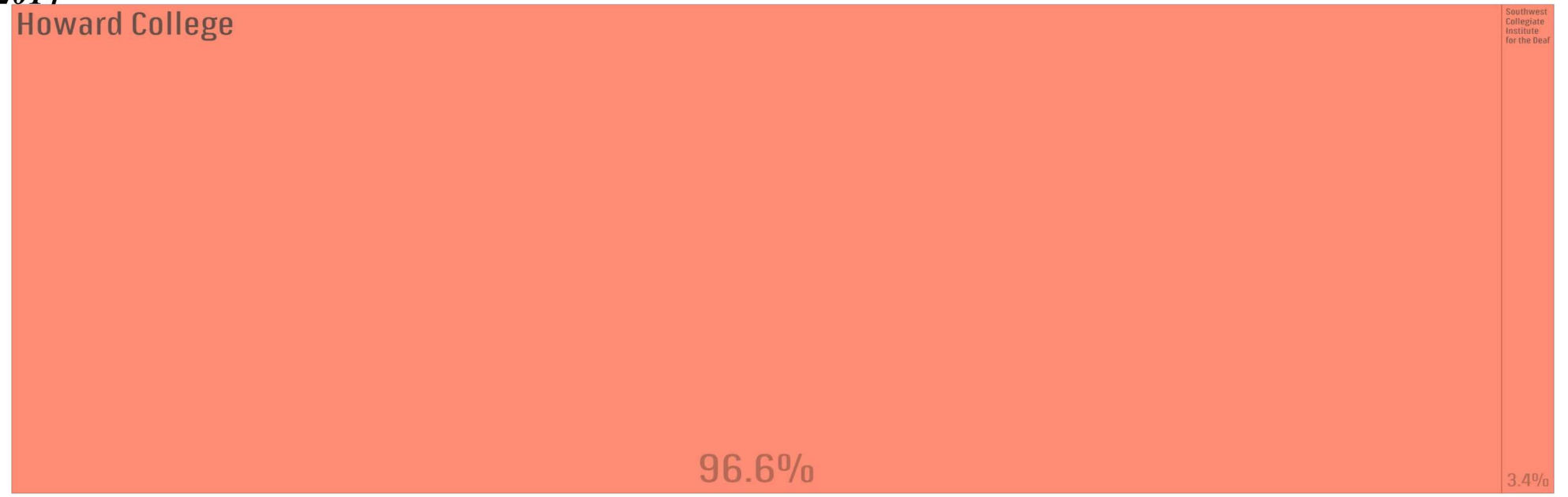

The median property value in Lamesa, TX Micro Area is \$62,200, which is 0.3 times less than the national average of \$205,000. Between 2015 and 2016 the median property value increased from \$62,100 to \$62,200, a 0.16% increase. The homeownership rate of Lamesa, TX Micro Area is 71.5%, which is higher than the national average of 63.6%. People in Lamesa, TX Micro Area have an average commute time of 16.6 minutes, and they commute by *Drove Alone*. 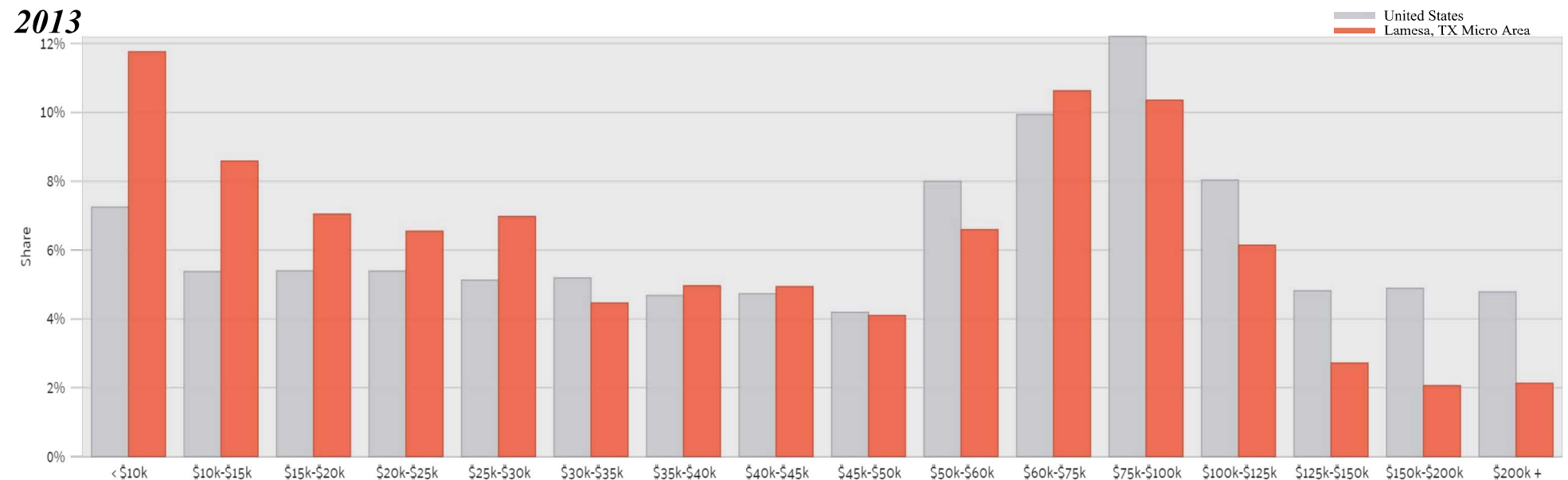

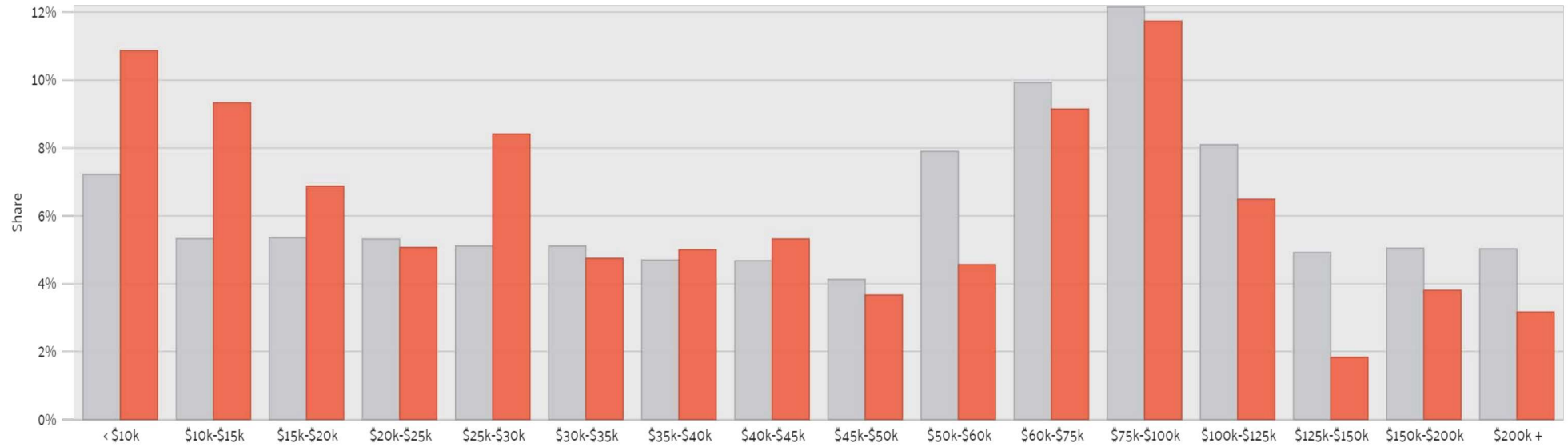

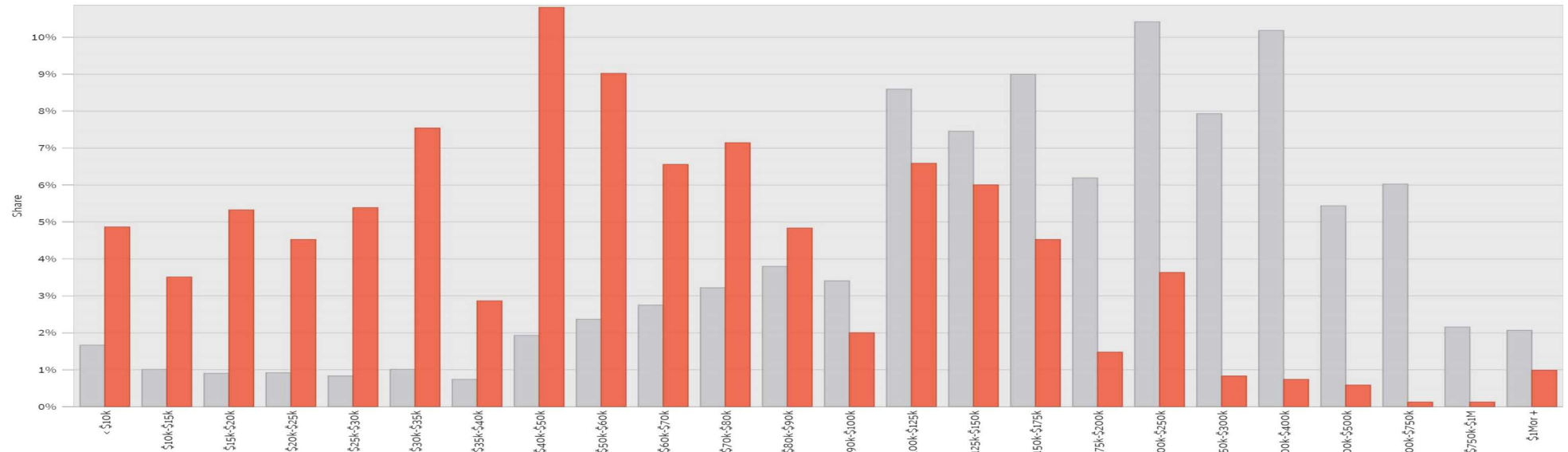
In 2016, the median property value in Lamesa, TX Micro Area grew to \$62,200 from the previous year's value of \$62,100.

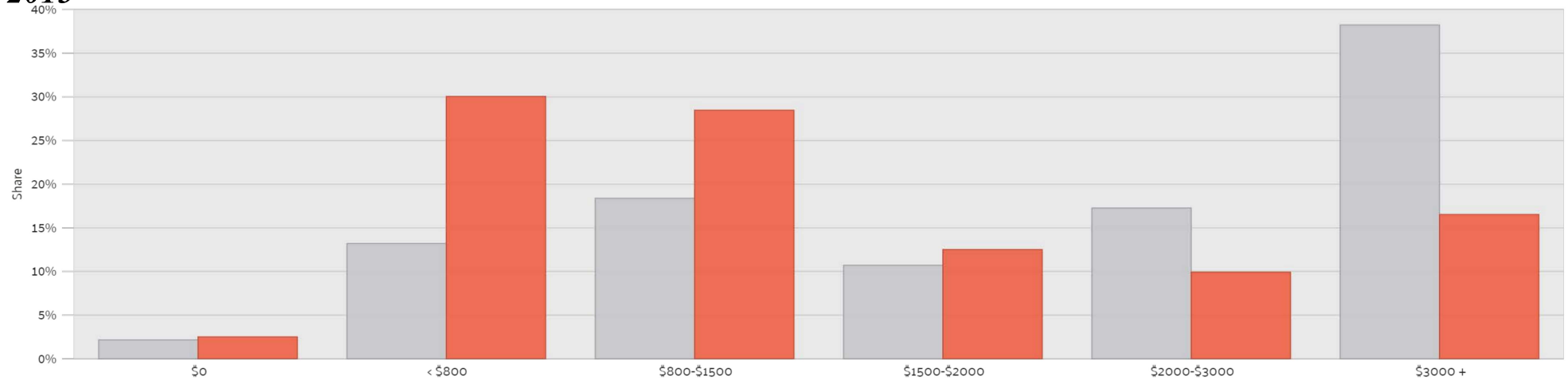

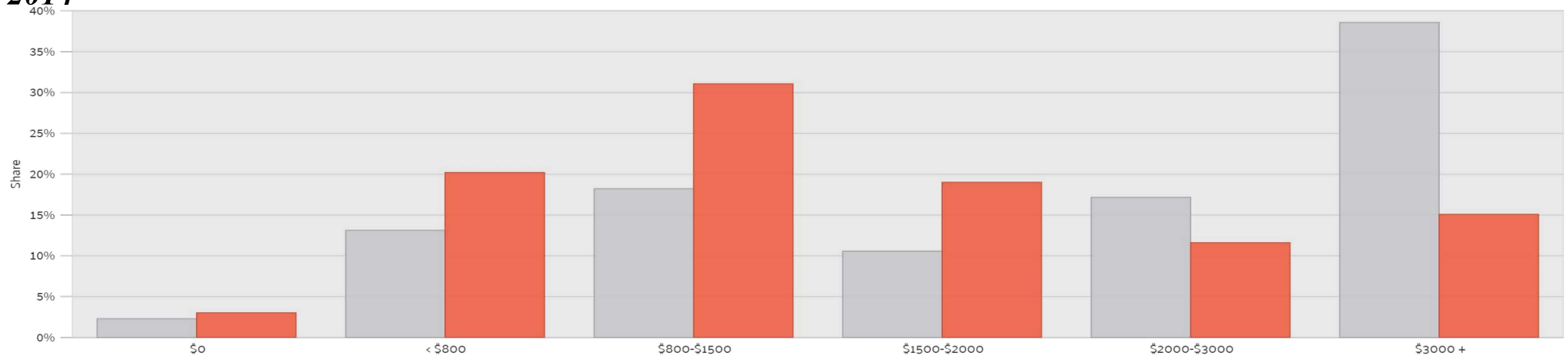

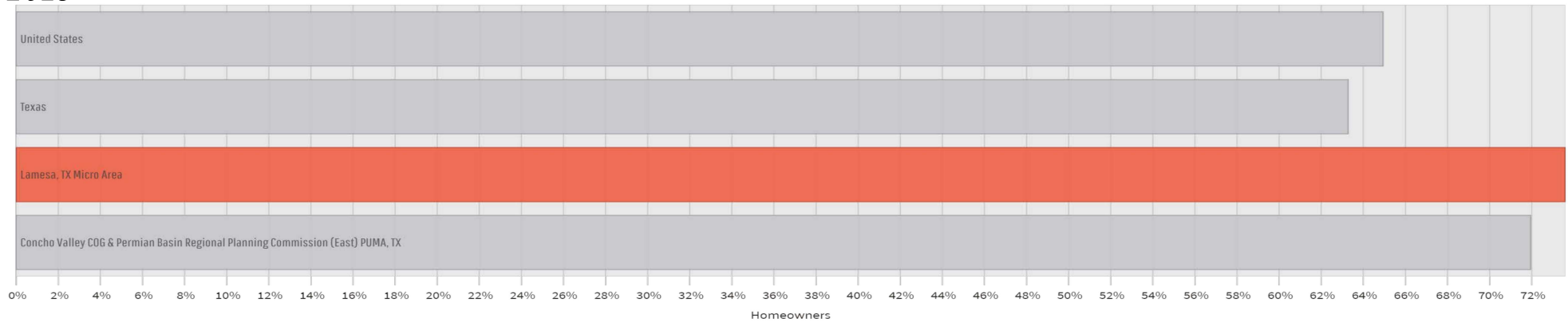

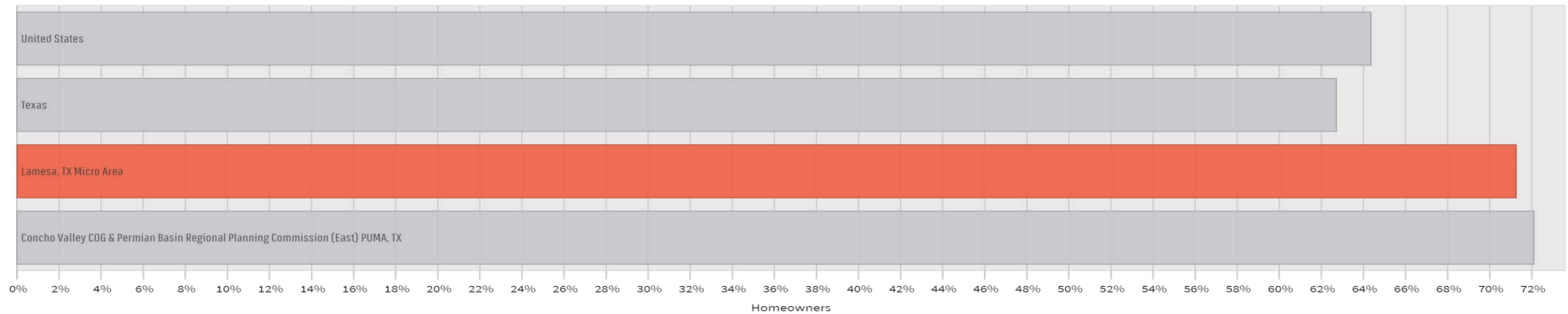
In 2016, 71.5% of the housing units in Lamesa, TX Micro Area were occupied by their owner. This percentage declined from the previous year's rate of 72%.

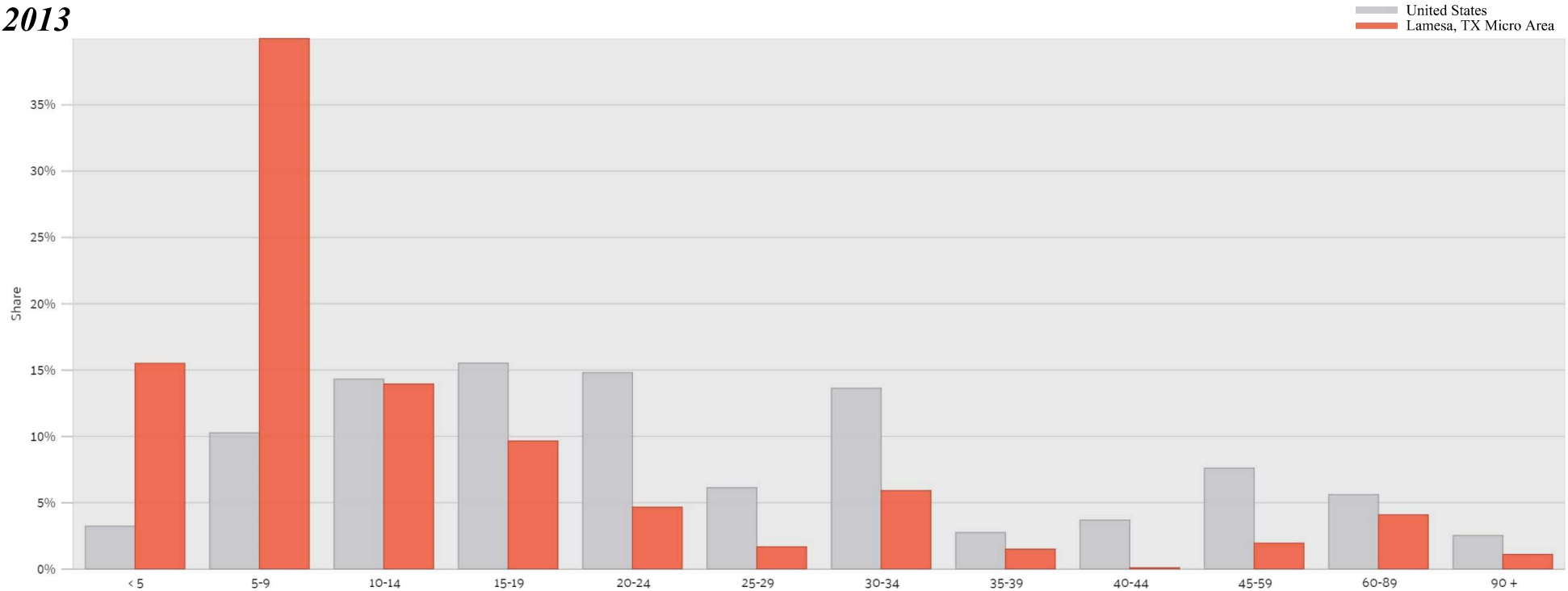
